Pecking Order

In 2020 Domino's signed the Better Chicken Commitment (BCC), since then we are working constantly on making progress and how processes can be changed within the next 4 years to reach our goals in 2026.

Domino's is working very hard to be able to respect all the different levels and commitments of the BCC that are even more difficult to meet in times of crisis.

Globally, Domino's is planning to have 100% of European chicken before 2026 and we are also working on a commitment for both pork and beef alongside with CIWF and our suppliers to get engaged on more sustainable methods for other proteins.

COMMITMENTS & TARGETS

1.1 Has the company published an overarching policy covering broiler chicken welfare?

Yes. Since the signature of the Better Chicken Commitment (BCC), we have published the list of the commitments related to the BCC on our website and an infographic explaining our commitments and the objectives for 2026.

1.2 - Has the company set a time bound commitment to achieve, or maintain, maximum stocking densities of 30 kg/m2 or 6 lbs./sq. foot for all broiler chickens?

Yes. The full achievement of this target is planned for 2026. We have partially achieved this goal as most of our suppliers for Germany and France are around 38/37kg/m2 but we continue working with our suppliers to improve this part, , step by step, to reach our goal in 2026.

1.3 - Has the company set a time bound commitment to use, or to continue to use, chickens bred for measurably improved welfare outcomes?

Yes. The achievement of the targets related to the Better Chicken Commitment is fixed for 2026.

1.4 - Has the company set a time bound commitment to provide, or to continue to provide, birds with specified meaningful enrichment?

Yes. The full achievement of this target is fixed for 2026. We already have partially completed this commitment in some of our countries. In France for example, we already have some farms with perches and/or straw balls and some farms with pecking substrates.

We are aiming to fully complete the goal by 2026 and we are doing our best to be able to achieve it earlier.

Regarding access to **natural light**, we have partially reached our objective in some of our countries and all our suppliers already respect the EU standards.

1.5 - Has the company set a time bound commitment to avoid, or to continue to avoid, using broiler cages or multi-tier systems?

Yes. The achievement of the targets related to the Better Chicken Commitment was initially fixed for 2026 but our suppliers already have cage free for 100% of our chicken.

1.6 - Has the company set a time bound commitment to use, or to continue to use, humane slaughter processes?

100% of our chicken (FR+DE) are slaughtered with stunning method with controlled gas atmosphere or by electric method to avoid any suffer.

1.7 - Has the company set a time bound commitment to ensuring compliance with its broiler welfare standards via third party auditing, or to maintaining the use of such auditing processes?

Yes. we have an active program to monitor the improvement of key welfare indicators for all our suppliers.

We are working on a timeline alongside with CIWF to respect the criteria of the BCC. We are also planning a date for an audit to work on our commitments as soon as possible. The audits will be done by a 3rd party every year.

1.8 Has the company made a commitment for 20% of birds to be housed in free range and winter garden systems?

No. There is no commitment today regarding a % of birds to be housed in free range and winter garden systems We have asked some suppliers if that could be feasible as the risk is higher for them due to the flu.

PERFORMANCE AND REPORTING

2.1 - Does the company report on the proportion of broiler chickens in their global supply that is stocked at densities of 30 kg/m2 or 6 lbs./sq. foot or less?

Yes. Most of our suppliers for Germany and France are already around 38/37kg/m. We continue to work with them to improve it in the coming years, step by step to reach our goal for all of our markets in 2026.

2.2 - Does the company report on the proportion of broiler chickens in their global supply that has been bred for measurably improved welfare outcomes?

No. We do not report officially on that yet, but we are working alongside with CIWF and our suppliers to be able to meet our engagement for 2026.

2.3 - Does the company report on the proportion of broiler chickens in their global supply that is kept in enriched environments?

Yes. The full achievement of this target is fixed for 2026. We have already partially completed this commitment in some of our countries (perches and/or straw balls, pecking substrates...) and we are aiming to fully complete the goal before the end of 2026.

Regarding access to **natural light**, we have partially reached our objective in some of our countries and all our suppliers already respect the EU standards.

2.4 - Does the company report on the proportion of broiler chickens in their global supply that is not kept in broiler cages or multi-tier systems?

Yes. Today 100% of our chicken are raised cage-free.

2.5 - Does the company report on the proportion of broiler chickens in their global supply that is processed using humane slaughter methods?

100% of our chicken (FR+DE) are slaughtered with stunning method with controlled gas atmosphere or by electric method to avoid any suffer.

2.6 - Does the company report on the proportion of broiler chickens in their global supply that has been assessed by third party auditors?

Yes. We have an active program to monitoring the improvement of key welfare indicators for all our suppliers.

We are working on a timeline alongside with CIWF to respect the criteria of the BCC. We are also planning a date for an audit to work on these criteria as soon as possible. The audits will be done by a 3rd party every year.

2.7 Does the company report on the proportion of broiler chickens in their global supply that are housed in free range and winter garden systems (up to 20%)?

No. We do not report yet on the % of birds to be housed in free range and winter garden systems
